Overview: From clinician connectivity to "smart" medical device; from personal health record patient portals, to the remote management of patient populations; health information technology is transforming virtually every aspect of the contemporary medical practice model. To better understand how this transformation began, and where its accelerating trajectory may lead, C. 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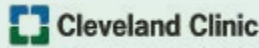
